Our speakers will give us their solutions to beating the recession from retail, industry and leisure perspectives and from the economic development officer view point.</p>		
<p>Friday 18th February 2011 – Somerset Cricket Club, Taunton <u>Development Finance and Viability</u> – Viability in planning has always been an issue shied away from by planners but infrastructure planning is now embodied in the LDF system and with the recession hitting the development industry hard, understanding development finance is a must for all professionals.</p>		
<p>Friday 18th March 2011 – The Innovation Centre, Exeter <u>Development Management - SPONSORED BY ASHFORDS</u> An update on planning law, advertisement control and thoughts on issues facing those at the “coal face” of Development Management (Development Control) with workshop sessions in the afternoon to consider the issues in more depth. Always a popular conference which needs to be booked early.</p>		
<p>Friday 8th April 2011 – Steam Museum, Swindon <u>Design and Masterplanning</u> – Proper planning of an area has never been as important as now when money is tight and even more is being asked of the developer. Speakers will include CABE and masterplanning specialists with a specific look at how individual case studies within the region have been planned for.</p>		
<p>Friday 13th May 2011 – Taunton Conference Centre <u>Infrastructure Planning</u> - Not all infrastructure is straight forward. This conference is an opportunity to find out more about some of the ‘newer’ infrastructure topics such as green infrastructure, modal shift, waste and how they can be funded. The event will include an update on where we are with CIL or its successor.</p>		
<p>Wednesday 15th June 2011 – Innovation Centre, Yeovil <u>Regeneration and Eco Development</u> – Eco development is here to stay and very much alive in Yeovil. The day will include looking at some of the eco initiatives being considered for Yeovil including renewable energy and regeneration opportunities and will include a study tour to the regeneration area and Demonstrator project funded by the Second Wave Eco Town Initiative.</p>		
<p>Friday 15th July 2011 – Roland Levinsky Building, Uni. of Plymouth <u>The Green Agenda</u> - We’re going Green – what does that mean? Topics will include the green outdoors, green buildings, green energy and green transport and the overriding importance of climate change in planning.</p>		

<p>Friday 9th September 2011 – National Maritime Museum, Falmouth Rural Planning – The rural area has always struggled for a voice but with the South West so reliant on these areas, how do they cope? Speakers will cover rural housing initiatives, small scale rural employment and rural leisure opportunities.</p>		
<p>Friday 14th October 2011 – RNLI, Poole Housing in areas of Constraint - Housing targets may have gone but the pressure for new housing remains and in many areas this creates conflict between housing numbers and the environment. Our speakers will endeavour to look at ways in which such conflict can be resolved and examine solutions being tried in the region.</p>		
<p>Wednesday 16th November 2011 - Burges Salmon Offices, Bristol Development Management - SPONSORED BY BURGESS SALMON An update on planning law and thoughts on issues facing those at the “coal face” of Development Management (Development Control) with workshop sessions in the afternoon to consider the issues in more depth. Always a popular conference which needs to be booked early.</p>		
<p>Friday 9th December 2011 – The Guildhall, Bath Raising Design Standards – ‘Eco-bling’, code for sustainable homes, building for life, PPS5. These are all having a huge effect on design at a time when climate change is at the heart of planning. Our speakers will investigate opportunities for delivering high quality design solutions in practice.</p>
