Planning Summer School Travelling Scholarship

Congratulations to Clare Healy (Arup) who fought off strong competition from across the UK to win the coveted 2011 Planning Summer School Travelling Scholarship. Clare, who lives in North London, graduated from University College London in September 2008 with an MSc in Spatial Planning, specialising in Urban Design.

Awarded to only one person each year, the scholarship attracts incredibly high calibre applications and there were nearly thirty entrants this year. The winner receives funding to carry out the research project that is the subject of their application. In return, they are asked to attend the annual Planning Summer School and present their findings to the assembled audience.

Clare's project will see her travel to South Korea to study the Cheonggyecheon River Restoration Scheme. Until 2005, the 5.8 km long river was 'lost' as a polluted sewer beneath a four-lane elevated highway, a victim of Seoul's rapid post-war economic growth. After a 40-year absence from Seoul's streetscape, the Cheonggyecheon was opened up, following a multi-million dollar investment programme.

In return Clare will be presenting her findings at the Summer School.



The 2011 Planning Summer School takes place in Swansea from 3rd to 7th September. It follows a new, faster paced, modular format this year. Whilst anyone can attend any day, the first two days are primarily aimed at elected members, the last two days will target planners and, for the first time, a combined Planning Summit will be sandwiched between the two
