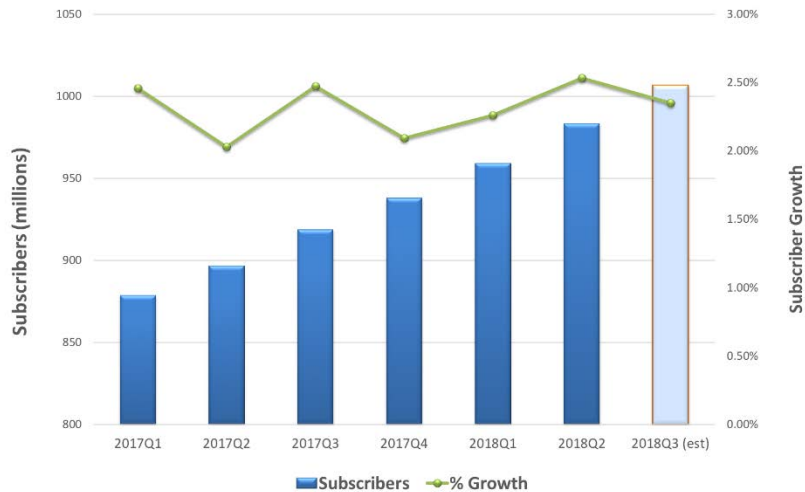


The Growth of the internet: stats and maps

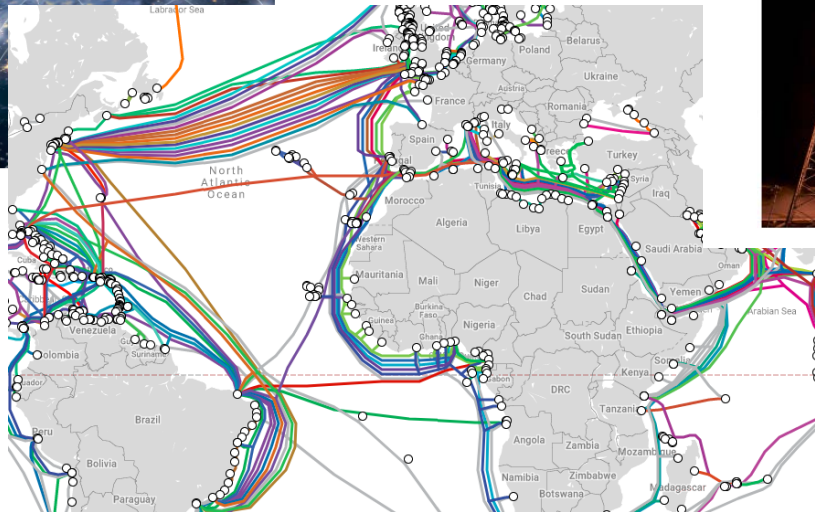

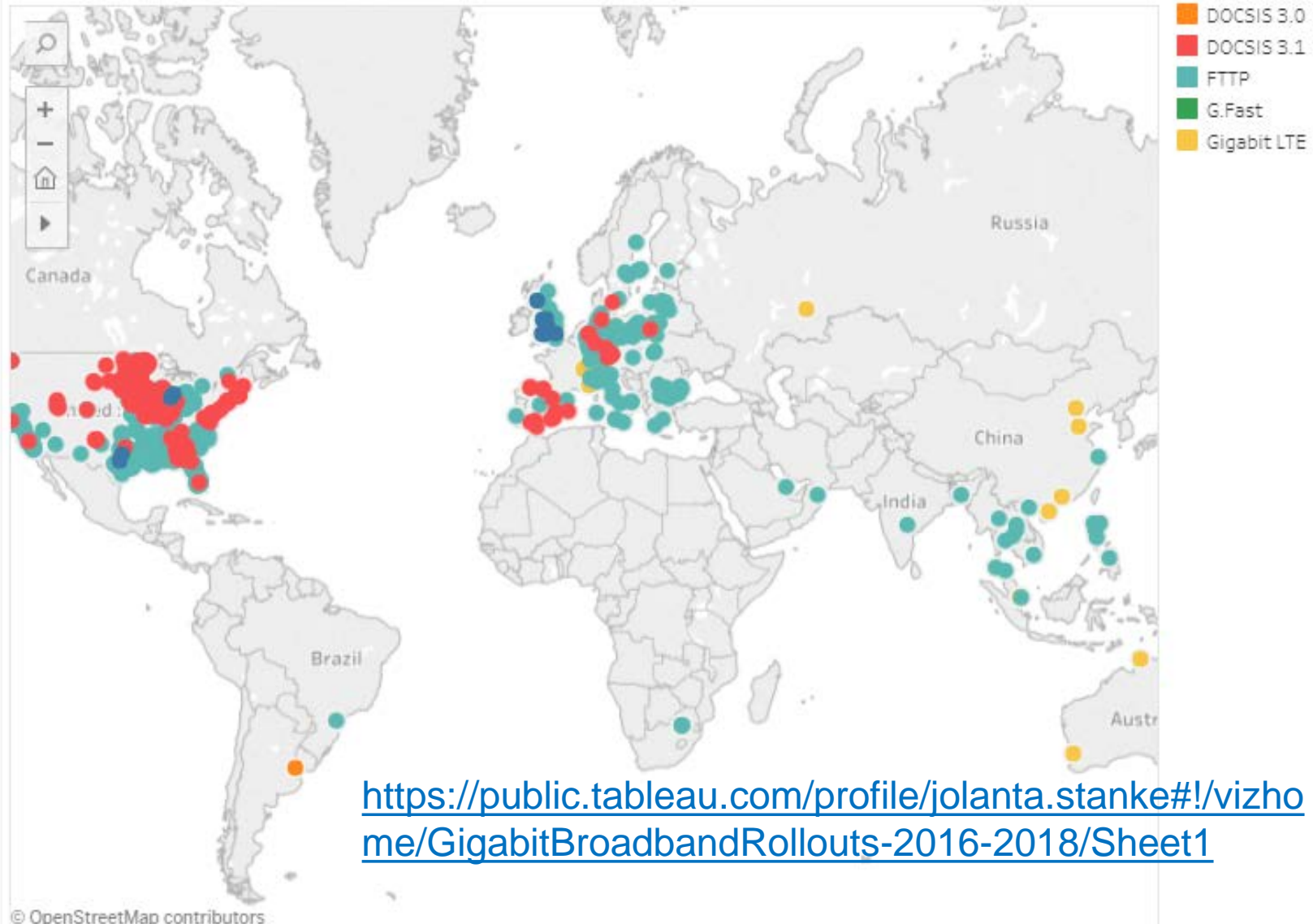

The Latest Gigabit Broadband Rollouts (2017-2018)

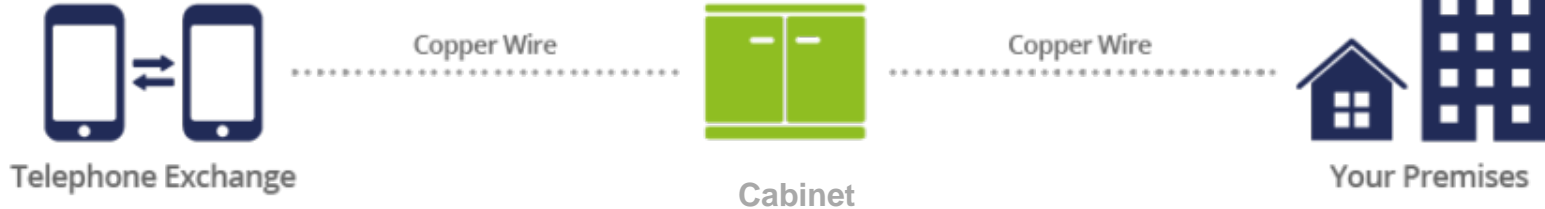

Smart cities (and other labels)

- Datacentres consume plenty of power – datacentres underwater and under ice
 - Improving but still a large impact
 - More efficiency – work from home, well planned deliveries
- The future is 5G – but that needs fibre.
 - Approx. 10% of the UKs infrastructure required for full fibre and 5G is in place.





Challenges – local and global

- Massive impacts on town planning
 - Wayleaves have been a major issue
 - Starting with the MDUs but it won't stop there
 - How to work with the operators?
 - Who repairs and replaces in 10 or 15 years?
- Systems integration
 - Re-engineer your processes
 - Update all your databases
 - Be aware of privacy and GDPR





Ten take-aways

1. Planning is core to the impact of broadband
2. Every roof, pole and surface is a possible money earner
3. Wayleaves (seem to be) a good mechanism for engaging (and controlling) operators
4. Try not to believe the hype – at least not the timescales
5. Stand on the shoulders of giants – lots of the work has been done
6. Bandwidth is bandwidth – be technology agnostic (but really it is fibre) since edge conditions exist
7. Meet ultimate grand objectives with smaller, compartmentalised steps
8. Single point of contact – where possible
9. Uber Eats/Deliveroo – and other network enabled services
10. Support local business – broadband can revitalise as well as cannibalise
